

Selecting the Right Replacement String

Use your harp's string chart to select the correct string to replace on your harp.

- Strings come in different materials, different thicknesses, different colors, and different lengths.
- Putting the wrong string on your harp could result in the string breaking quickly, sounding bad, or even damaging your harp.
- Starting from the top, count down to the broken string.
- Write down the string number and the note name with octave (like F2, or C4).
- Order a full replacement set if possible, or at least a skeleton set (1 of each nylon type).

If you don't have your harp's string chart:

- Ask the person or company who sold you the harp
- Look on the harp maker's website
- Contact a harp string sales company, like

- Ask your harp instructor
